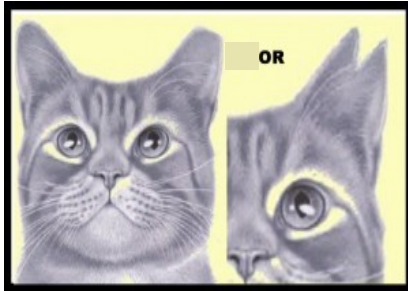


Have you seen cats

A cat with a “tipped”
left ear is a cared for,
spayed/neutered, and
vaccinated cat that
belongs to a colony.
Most of these cats are
not suitable for indoor
living.

An ear tip is a sign
that this is a Trap/
Neuter/Return cat. It
is not a lost cat. Do
not take it to an
animal shelter. Unless
the cat is in distress,
please leave it alone.

People in your
community have
donated time and
money to sterilize and
vaccinate this cat
against rabies.

Cats are masters of survival, even when abandoned by their family or pushed out of their barnyard colonies.

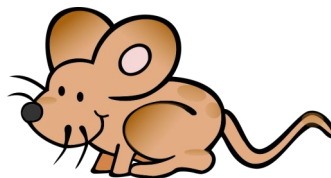
Unfortunately, they are also prolific breeders. There are thousands of intact outdoor cats in Northwest Wisconsin producing tens of thousands of kittens who will suffer and die. Many more will never find homes and continue to produce more kittens.

These cats survive in abandoned buildings, city sewers, farms and stables. In rural Wisconsin we need cats to control rodent populations. However when there is an overpopulation of any species conflicts occur. Our mission is to reach out to the communities who have intact outdoor cats and assist them with TNR.



Effective management of cat colonies requires a commitment from citizens, veterinarians, community businesses and local governments.

Farm, Feral & Stray works with these groups providing education and protecting public health by offering low or no cost spay/neuter services and rabies vaccinations to these cats through our Trap-Neuter-Return program.
